tell you what I know. First I will  
tell you how I am connected with  
him. My Father was a son of John C.  
and Susan (Younkin) Lichliter, and  
Marcellus a son of Levi & Katie (Younkin)  
Lichliter, and John C & Levi were  
brothers and Susan & Katie were  
cousins. Susan Younkin was a daughter  
of Henry & Betsy (Reimus) Younkin and Henry  
was a son of Jacob & Hannah Nichols  
Younkin, so I am a direct descendant  
of the Rev. soldier, according to all this  
history I have accumulated. I know  
Katie was a cousin of Grandmothers but  
can you tell me just where she belongs.

Levi & Katie Ann had three sons,  
Norman B. died Pasadena California, Milton  
died at Joplin Mo. and Marcellus D.

died in Harrisburg in Dec. 1917.  
His son Rev. McIlla F. Lichliter is  
pastor of First Congregational Church  
of Columbus Ohio since 1924, he  
has a son James Marcellus who  
delivered his first sermon from his  
fathers pulpit at Columbus Sept 4 - 1932.  
Rev M. L. had given 19 years of service  
to the M. E. church prior to going to  
Columbus.

Ler is buried at Wesley Chapel died  
1862, Katie Ann, we think is buried  
at Usina but are not sure, do you know?

My father died 1925. He was named  
for his Uncle Ler.

the family tree? I am very much  
interested in family history, have been  
to both Junkin Reunions, but guess  
I was too modest to get acquainted  
with the chairman. I am a great  
student of family history, so if I can
