INFORMATION about the RESIDENTS OF PADDYTOWN

Ezekial HICKMAN

The stream called Hickman's Run, bisects the heart of Paddytown. It is named after the early settler Ezekial Hickman, from Captain Steele's 1768 list of Turkeyfoot squatters on Indian lands. He was born in 1725, from Frederick, Maryland, and died 27 April 1779. He was married to Elizabeth Trammell. He served in the War of Independence, under Captain Samuel Miller, in the 8th Regiment. He had at least one son Joshua born 1766, who died in Indiana in 1842.

The name Hickman has been long established as a surname in County Clare, Ireland.

Catherine <u>PATTON</u> Younkin.

The name Patton means little Patrick.

She was born 1771, in Pennsylvania, according to the 1850 Census. That would make her 18 or 19 when she married Frederick Younkin, circa 1790. Her first child was born 1791, or in 1792, when Frederick was first listed as paying tax at Turkeyfoot Township, Bedford County.

According to the Census there were no Pattons in Bedford County, in 1790, nor were there any Pattons in Tinicum, Bedminster, or Haycock Township of Bucks County, where Frederick Younkin came from.

The only known Patton from this time period was an **Irish** John Patton, (b.1793) who declared his citizenship in 1808, at Somerset. He founded the newspaper The Somerset Whig, in 1810. He worked for a time with his brother Thomas who sold his interest in the newspaper John and Jacob Glessner in 1829. John was a graduate of Trinity College of Dublin, Ireland, and died in 1836 at Somerset.

From obit. of Mrs. Susan (Michael) Sanner Daughter of John Patton (b. 1793), one of two **English** brothers, who came to this country as printers and bookbinders and were men of more than ordinary intelligences. They established a book printing office here, which they conducted with marked success until 1803 when James removed to Uniontown, where he established the Genius of Liberty, a weekly newspaper. John remained in Somerset and a few years later, or about 1812 established the Somerset Whig, which he edited with (s?) ability up until the time of his death.

Catherine Patton Younkin's home farm was bought from James McMillan. James warranted this plot of 158 acres in 1786. After buying this from McMillan the Younkin's had it surveyed in 1811. Another parcel of 124 acres - which adjoined the 158 acres on the south - was purchased from Amos Johnston, in 1807. Johnston had warranted this property in 1786. The Younkin farm was at the northern edge of the

area that became known as Paddytown. It remains in the Younkin family to this day. Catherine's remains are buried on the farm next to Frederick.

Catherine and Frederick had 11 children;

Colonel John Calvin, married the Irish immigrant Kathleen Jane Connelly, of Barney and Elizabeth. They moved to near Agency, Iowa.

Frederick's first wife Maria Barbara died.

1789, June 9th, Jacob "Yonken" paid 10 pounds in Penn Certificates for 100 acres of Turkeyfoot land at Philadelphia, this is the same date as the warrant of 217 acres that was surveyed the 2nd of May 1794, in Turkeyfoot Township.

Joseph Rhoads PRINGEY married Margaret Younkin circa 1833.

They lived on the 124 acres Frederick Younkin purchased from Amos Johnston and another 73 acres that Joseph Pringey patented in 1839, which was just east of the original 124 acre tract. By 1847 Joseph and Margaret moved to the northern edge of Preston County (West) Virginia, north of Bruceton Mills.

CONNELLY

The three Connelly brothers arrived to Paddytown in 1797. Francis soon sold out to his brothers and moved to Maryland, then Ohio. Edward sold his interest in the Paddytown farm to his brother Barney and moved to Ohio in the 1820s.

EDWARD moved to Ohio with Francis. His only known child James C. died at Petersburg in October 1830.

FRANCIS born 15 April 1761, Co. Antrim, Ireland, died 1850s Walnut Twp. Fairfield County, Ohio, after living in Maryland for a time.

He married Margaret Quinn Connelly b. 1762.

"Old Place" in Turkeyfoot Twp. adjoining Bernard Connelly and Philson's large tract, 300 acres 100 acres clear, with a house and barn with two orchards.

Also, 150 acres, adjoining John Drury and John McClintock and others, very much dilapidated and decayed and altogether unproductive.

Estate was altogether, "insufficient to pay the balance of the debts of said estate and to maintain and educate the minor children of the deceased."

James McMillan, 20 August 1735 – 1821 March 29, was indentured to Thomas McMillan, his brother, in Hanover Township, of Chester County, later Lancaster and now Dauphin County Pennsylvania. He is listed on the Chester County tax records from 1750 to 1784. At 15, James was listed as a weaver. After his seven-year indenture he married Eleanor Wright, 26 Feb. 1735 – November 1820, the daughter of his next-door neighbor James Wright, born in Ireland in 1716 – died 1764, and wife Margaret, who died 1793. Reverend Roan married James and Eleanor at the Paxtang Presbyterian Church, on 7 May 1757. (see photos of Church) Eleanor's sisters married as follows; Margaret to William Moore 1 June 1761, Jane married Mr. Russell, Jemima married William Wharton, and Agnes married John Malcolm. All of the sisters moved to WV or Va. A brother William was killed in the War of Independence and there may have been another brother killed in the war. In 1784, Eleanor and James were listed as executors of her brother William's estate. James McMillan served in the War of Independence under Captain William Allen in the 9th Battalion of the Lancaster County Militia, Hanover Twp. 1780 and 1782. Another record shows James served under Captain R. Shanous, First Battalion, called up 11 September 1777, an established DAR record.

Anna Wright McMillan was the mother of Eleanor Bayes. Thomas Bayes was the son of Jewell Stephen Bayes. His grandfather came to from Va. through Md. and bought land in Middletown, Bucks County, Pa. in 1699 next to the land of John Jewell,- no doubt their children married.

From the Biographical review for Bedf. And Som. Co. 1899, pg 193 – 195, John K. McMillan did general farming and operated a tannery. Early on he was Whig and became a staunch Republican, served several years as a Post Master, eminent in piety and an active member of the Methodist Church, united when young. His second son Jehu learned tanning from his father and purchased a tannery in Addison Twp.. He retired from this after turning this business over to his son Charles R.

A Thomas McMillan who came from Ballynacree Co. Antrim Ireland to Pa. with his wife Deborah and children. Died 9 month 1753 at burial ground of Wellsville, York Co.Pa.

John 1764 – 1856, was a Methodist from an early age married to Nancy Kilpatrick of John.

John K. was the eldest son of John and Nancy.

John K. was Postmaster 1859 – 1870 (father John died 1856)

John K. had no vats or leeches and took large chestnut logs and made troughs in which to lime bait and tan his hides. Charles R. was still using these methods in 1906. Brother Samuel married Rachel Pringey

Jacob R. was the eldest son of John K. and second wife Mary Rush.

He ran a tannery and was elected Justice of the Peace several terms, Associate Judge of Somerset Co. and served two terms as a member of Pa. house of representatives. Charles R. McMillan served 15 years or three terms as Justice of Peace and was elected tax collector.

A water wheel brought water to tanning pits.

Hides were first soaked for several weeks in liming pits of calcium oxide. (Lime)

Skins were then laid on logs. The hair was then removed with curved unhairing knifes.

Skins were then turned over and flesh was removed with fleshing knifes.

Hides were then soaked in "ooze" made from hemlock or oak bark. The hides were stirred from time to time.

A piece of leather was cut off to see if it was brown through.

A currier finished the leather by rubbing tanners oil (?) and tallow into it. He trampled the stretched leather.

Article says J.K. used hollowed logs for vats.

Used urine and Hemlock bark?

PHILSON

ROBERT PHILSON, (c. 1759 – July 25, 1831) was an Irish-American soldier and politician. Philson was born in County Donegal, Ulster, Ireland, and immigrated to Pennsylvania with his uncle John Fletcher. They kept a store in Berlin, Bedford County, Pennsylvania. Inn still exists today.

Married Judith Lowry 1770 - 1853

1782, Served in the Revolutionary War as a Sgt. With Capt. Terr. Campbell of Cumberland County Pa.

In 1794, Philson was arrested for his involvement in the Whiskey Rebellion. He was sent to Philadelphia for trial, but he and his co-defendant, Herman Husband, were acquitted.

In 1795 he was elected to the State legislature.

Beginning in 1800, Philson served as associate judge of <u>Somerset County</u>, <u>Pennsylvania</u>, for twenty years.

1819 – 1821, also served as a one-term congressman during the <u>16th United States</u> <u>Congress</u>. **Member of the <u>U.S. House of Representatives</u> from Pennsylvania's 8th congressional district**

Philson was commissioned a <u>brigadier general</u> of the Second Brigade, Tenth Division, <u>Pennsylvania militia</u> on May 9, 1800. During the <u>War of 1812</u>, he served as a brigadier general of the Second Brigade, Twelfth Division, Pennsylvania Volunteers.

In 1794, Philson was active in and arrested during the Whiskey Rebellion. He raised a "liberty pole" at his log store on the square, and advised citizens to oppose a U.S. laws. According to Wikipedia: "The farmers who resisted, many war veterans, contended that they were fighting for the principles of the American Revolution, in particular against taxation without local representation, while the Federal government maintained the taxes were the legal expression of the taxation powers

He was sent to Philadelphia for trial, but he and his co-defendant, Herman Husband, were acquitted.

p.136, Robert Philson erected a liberty pole in front of his house and a whole regiment was sent to effect his capture at night surrounding his house. He said he'd be down after he put on his pants. Philson was the only arrest at Berlin. When they left Berlin Philson was riding a black mare of his own and when they stopped at the top of the mountain Philson told his captors that if they would give him a good stick two foot long and his black mare he would whip the entire party, where upon he was mounted on a slow horse and kept under a strong guard all the way to Philadelphia.

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<u>Isaiah STRAWN</u>3 (Lancelot1, Jacob2), son of Jacob and Christiana (Pursell) Strawn, born in Strawntown, Haycock Township, 10 mo. 28, 1758, died in Florid Township, Putnam County, Illinois, 8 mo. 2, 1843.

He entered the

Continental service in the fall of 1777 as a teamster. At the Battle of Germantown, seeing one of his neighbor's sons in the ranks fall mortally wounded, he seized his musket and took his [page 537] place in the ranks. He was wounded in the left leg, carrying a British buckshot in that member until his death.

He was disowned by Richland Monthly Meeting 1 mo. 17, 1782 for his participation in the war. He married, 8 mo. 12, 1781, Rachel Reed, daughter of Captain John Reed, and officer in the Revolutionary Army from New Jersey, and his wife, Thankful Honawell, and sister to Jeremiah Reed, who married his sister Jerusha. Rachel was born 7 mo. 1, 1763, and died 4 mo. 2, 1843. Isaiah had learned the blacksmith trade and followed that vocation in Haycock until his removal with his family to Turkey Foot Township, now Somerset

County, Pa., which occurred soon after his marriage. He carried on his trade in Turkey Foot until the spring of 1817 when he sold out and moved overland to Knox County, Ohio, and located on a farm previously purchased where the town of Martinsburg now stands. It was then a primeval forest but when cultivated

made a fine farm which he improved. In 1837 he sold his farm and removed to Florida Township, Putnam County, Illinois, and purchased a finely improved farm adjoining that of his son Jeremiah, and lived thereon until his death. He and his wife became members of the Methodist Episcopal Church soon after their marriage, and their family were reared in that faith. Hon. Perry A. Armstrong, his great-grandson, says of him:Isaiah Strawn never had a lawsuit or made an active enemy. He took no interest in local politics and never sought or held an office except one collector of taxes. Too generous to oppress the poor, he marked their taxes paid upon the tax roll but had to sell a whole pen full of his fat hogs to make up the shortage. This discouraged all further office holding. His lips were never stained with tobacco nor did them utter profane or really vulgar language. Liquors he kept, as was the custom in those days, as a means of showing hospitality to visitors, but he never tasted it himself. He never went in debt. Pay as you go was his favorite maxim and rule of his life. What he bought he paid for and what he could not pay for he did not buy even though he might need it ever so much. No man ever held the note of this Isaiah Strawn.
